Also note that volumes 10, 11, and 12 have been indexed for each species mentioned, and for photos, so greater detail is available for those volumes. That index, prepared by Jim Johnson and published previously in *Oregon Birds*, has been included in this publication as Appendix A.

History of Oregon Ornithology 65

This section includes articles dealing principally with the history of Oregon ornithology. Note that some of these are useful for research on the status of a given species, or the birds of a region. Some articles appearing in other sections include significant historical information. Considerable data regarding older Oregon bird records can be found in several of the Gahmken Press publications listed in the back of this publication.

Identification 66

This section includes material that focuses on identification. Note that many of these articles also provide status information, just as many articles in the **Status** section, especially those on rarities, provide identification information.

Listing and birding travel 67

This section contains articles related to listing and related topics.

In Memoriam 68

This section lists articles regarding birders and ornithologists who have died.

Oregon Bird Records Committee 69

This section includes the reports of the Oregon Bird Records Committee (OBRC) and related material.

Oregon Field Ornithologists (OFO) 70

This section contains information about the establishment, history, function, and meetings of OFO and its predecessor, the Southern Willamette Ornithological Club (SWOC). It also includes references to the previous indices to *Oregon Birds*.

Pelagic birds and trips 72

Results of trips and commentary on Oregon seabirds.

Regional Studies and Lists 72

This section deals with studies, lists, and similar material regarding *large* sections of the state, in particular counties or sections of counties, refuges, sizable regions, and so on. These are mostly research articles not intended as "site guides." Guides to the birds of smaller areas, and a few guides to larger regions, appear under **Site Guides**, which are intended to be guides for visiting birders. Many site guides include significant distributional information.

Research and Requests 73

This section includes all requests for information regarding Oregon

birds. It is based on the cumulative summary of such requests in the summer, 1990 issue, and is brought to date only through the last issue of 1991.

- Reviews**..... 76
This section contains reviews of books, tapes, and a few related items.
- Site Guides** 77
This section contains items of interest mainly to visiting birders. Most in-depth studies are included under **Regional Studies and Lists**. However, many of the site guides contain considerable data about the birds of little-known parts of the state. Sites are organized by county.
- Species Finding Guides**..... 80
These articles and short notes are intended principally to help birders find particular species. They vary in length from a sentence to several pages. See also the **Status** section. Titles have in some cases been rearranged or truncated in order to organize the section by species.
- Status** 82
This section includes longer works on the status of particular species or small groups of species in Oregon. It also includes articles on first state records and other rarities. A few articles fall on the edge of this category.
- Taxonomy and Related Issues**..... 88
This section contains information about changes in the AOU Checklist as well as other taxonomic matters.
- Miscellaneous** 88
This section contains a variety of material that did not fit well into other categories.

Bibliographic Commentary*

Martha Schmitt

The bibliographic history of *Oregon Birds* is somewhat complicated; users of the Index should be aware of this. The change of name from SWOC TALK to *Oregon Birds* occurred in 1977 in the middle of Vol. 3. The last issues of SWOC TALK are Vol. 3, No. 1, Jan./Feb. 1977 - vol. 3, No. 3, May/June 1977 pages continuously.

With the change of name, volume numbering was discontinued and all issues of *Oregon Birds* through Vol. 5 are paged individually. Aug./Sept. 1977, Oct./Nov. 1977 and Dec. 1977/Jan. 1978 were published as Issue No. 1 - Issue No. 3. With Issue No. 4, Feb./Mar. 1978, volume numbering was resumed, continuous with SWOC TALK and Issues 1 - 3, 1977 regarded as Vol. 3, No. 4 - 6. The editors and indexer agreed that these issues would be so cited in the Index:

Issue No. 1, Aug./Sept. 1977 as Vol. 3, No. 4

Issue No. 2, Oct./Nov. 1977 as Vol. 3, No. 5

Issue No. 3, Dec. 1977/Jan. 1978 as Vol. 3, No. 6

Issue numbering was discontinued after Issue No. 5, Vol. 4, No. 2, April/May 1978. Only three issues, Vol. 4, No. 1, Feb./Mar. 1978 - Vol. 4, No. 3, June/July 1978, were published in 1978; Vol. 4, No. 4, Aug./Sept./ 1978, Vol. 4, No. 5, Oct. 1978 and Vol. 4, No. 6, Dec. 1978 were published in early 1979. After Vol. 5, No. 1, Feb. 1979, monthly designations were discontinued and the remaining issues of 1979 bear only volume, number and year citations.

Introduction to the Cumulative Index

Alan Contreras

This is an index, not a bibliography for each or all of the authors whose work appears in *Oregon Birds*. As a consequence, entries are arranged and prepared for the convenience of people interested in locating material, and may not serve well for other purposes. This index includes most material in every issue of *Oregon Birds* and its predecessor, *SWOC TALK*, published from Volume 1, Number 1 (January-February 1975) through Volume 22, Number 4 (Fall 1996). Some minor items are not included. It includes an author index, a title index organized by subject, and selected special-purpose indices.

This index incorporates work done by several people over many years. In particular, the following indices previously published in *Oregon Birds* have been newly word-processed, revised, and combined with my own index to *OB* Volumes 13-17.

Each of the earlier indexers followed somewhat different conventions regarding style and content. This cumula-

tive index does not attempt to standardize all aspects of the earlier indices. However, certain items have been arranged in certain ways for the convenience of the user. A brief overview of these bibliographic conventions can be found in the table of contents, where the categories used have been set forth. A large number of items have been lumped together in the **Miscellaneous** category.

Some material has not been indexed. In general, this is information regarding events, rare bird alerts, and other material with a short life span. Some may regret its absence; they are welcome to index it. Two categories of this type of information have been handled in a modified way. Requests for information about Oregon birds, which were often repeated in multiple issues, have been listed once only under the heading **Research and Requests**. I have provided only the species name and the citation. Requests for information are not included after volume 17.

Some titles have suffered minor tinkering in the interest of reader convenience. For example, the headings of the Field Notes sections of *Oregon Birds* have varied slightly over the years, e.g., by the presence or absence of a colon, or of all capitals. I have standardized these somewhat. A few parenthetical notes have been added in brackets to explain obscure or erroneous titles.

Regarding attribution, any article for which the author's name was not printed with the article is listed under "Anonymous" except in a few cases when the author is known. Many of these articles and notes are quite significant, and are often by the editor, particularly in the early years of the publication.

Volume-Year Concordance and Roster of Editors

Oregon Birds began in 1975 as *SWOC TALK*, the newsletter of the Southern Willamette Ornithological Club (SWOC), based in Eugene. This group still meets but does not produce a publication. SWOC and its newsletter were founded by George A. "Chip" Jobanek of Walterville, Lane County, who lives today in Eugene and contributes frequently to *Oregon Birds*. He was the first editor of what became Oregon's statewide bird publication.

The following list provides concordance between ST/OB volume numbers and years of issue. In some cases the actual year of issue was later than the titular year, especially with the early late-fall issues, which sometimes appeared after the first of the following year. See Martha Schmitt's bibliographical commentary for details regarding the numbering of volumes and the transition between names and numbering systems. The following list also includes all editors of *Oregon Birds* and *SWOC TALK*.

SOO No. 2. **A Guide to the Bird Notes of Grace McCormac French of Yamhill County, Oregon.** Bayer, Range. 1986. An index to the field notes of this pioneer ornithologist (1881-1957), this also includes biographical information, her bird arrival and departure dates for the Dayton-Carlton area, and other information. This is an essential reference for anyone studying the birds of Yamhill County or the northern Willamette Valley, especially because these notes, mostly unpublished, were not used in Gabrielson and Jewett's *Birds of Oregon*.

SOO No. 3. **Reed Ferris' 1930-1943 Bird Banding Records and Bird Observations for Tillamook County, Oregon.** Bayer, Range and Ferris, Reed. 1987. A compilation of records for Tillamook County, especially of seabirds and banding data. Also provides a fascinating account of the lives of Alex Walker, Reed Ferris and others studying the birds of the north coast. An essential reference for regional or historical research.

SOO No. 4. **Waterbird and Mammal Censuses at Siuslaw Estuary, Lane County, Oregon.** Bayer, Range and Lowe, Roy W. 1988. Surveys over several years of the waterbirds of the estuary. Includes both species accounts and accounts by survey.

SOO No. 5. **Oiled Birds: How to search for and capture oiled birds at Oregon intertidal areas.** Bayer, Range D. 1988 How to systematically find oiled birds.

SOO No. 6. **The Cormorant/Fisherman conflict in Tillamook County, Oregon.** Bayer, Range D., 1989. Examination of controversy about cormorants eating salmon smolts.

SOO No. 7. **Records of Bird Skins Collected Along the Oregon Coast.** Bayer, Range. 1989. This 245-page publication includes a vast pool of information regarding specimens collected, including collectors, dates, and species. Records are from the 1880s through 1980s, and represent birds in the collections of 80 different institutions. It also includes a depressingly long list of lost OSU specimens. This is an essential reference for serious distributional or historical research.

SOO No. 8. **Birds of the Coast Range of Lincoln County, Oregon: Vol. I: Birds of Thornton Creek.** Faxon, Darrel and Bayer, Range. 1991. Detailed records for this small area on the central coast.
